Mostafa Abdelbary is an award-winning scholar from the STEM High School for Boys in 6th of October. Throughout his studies, Mostafa demonstrated leadership potential, impact-oriented thinking, and intellectual curiosity that drove him towards success. As a Student Union Committee Head, Mostafa started a courseware initiative that taught over 200 students soft and technological skills, organized lectures with professors, and helped students publish their first research papers. As an ambitious student, Mostafa has won multiple awards including the Nasa Space Apps Cairo Award in 2017 and the International Genius Olympiad Bronze medal in space app design, robotics, and renewable energy respectively.

In his junior year, Mostafa co-founded Re-Nile, an energy and environment solutions startup that is introducing new products in solar tracking and fish-farm technologies in Egypt, in partnership with a team of engineers from Zewail University. Mostafa patented his solar tracker in the National Academy of Scientific Research and Technology and is currently working on introducing the product to the market. Mostafa is also the EducationUSA Competitive College Club President at AMIDEAST. Through the support of The "Onsi Sawiris Scholarship Program", Mostafa will be attending Stanford University to pursue a Bachelor's in Computer Science and Economics.

NADIA NEGM – GRANT UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA BERKELEY

Nadia Negm was recruited by the University of California Berkeley's rowing team in December 2017 after studying and training in Switzerland for three years. Nadia's passion for rowing was sparked when she started rowing on the Nile in Cairo when she was 12 years old.

At the age of 18, she was the first Egyptian woman to reach the quarter finals at the Olympic games in Rio de Janeiro in 2016 where she was also the youngest rower. Prior to that, Nadia had been representing Egypt on the international level with her debut at the 2014 African Rowing Championships where she won second place.

Nadia pursued rowing on an elite level while maintaining her academics and managed to successfully complete her International Baccalaureate.

As a proud Egyptian female athlete, Nadia aspires to become a two-time Olympian through training with Berkeley and represent Egypt at the next Olympic Games in 2020 in Tokyo. Nadia hopes to contribute to placing Egypt on the map of world rowing and to be a role model for other potential athletes in Egypt that are yet to be discovered.

Nadia's academic ambition is to hold a degree in media communication and film at Berkeley. She believes that graduating from Berkeley as a student-athlete and Egyptian woman, would provide her with multiple opportunities to impact the lives of other Egyptians upon her return home.
